Italian neorealism refers to a period in italian film where stories were set against the poor and working class in post world war ii italy the style was further defined and supported by critics of the italian periodical cinema who had tired of the poor quality mainstream films of the time. The film s influence on post war italian cinema is undeniable most pronounced perhaps in a lesser known 1950 picture from luciano emmer called a sunday in august emmer s film which featured franco interlenghi from de sica s shoeshine sciuscià 1946 as well as an early performance from marcello mastroianni was considered the first example of neorealismo rosa pink. However the stylistic feature of such italian works of giallo are so different and distinguished that nowadays giallo is remembered not by the yellow covered paperback crime book of aghata christie edgar wallace and raymond chandler published in italy but by an array of movies directed by filmmakers like dario argento mario bava sergio martino pupi avati and many more.
