The transcultural nursing theory first appeared in leininger s culture care diversity and universality published in 1991 but it was developed in the 1950s the theory was further developed in her book transcultural nursing which was published in 1995. In 1995 madeleine leininger defined transcultural nursing as a substantive area of study and practice focused on parative cultural care caring values beliefs and practices of individuals or groups of similar or different cultures with the goal of providing culture specific and universal nursing care practices in promoting health or well being or to help people to face unfavorable human conditions illness or death in culturally meaningful ways. The first professional nurse with graduate preparation to plete a doctorate in anthropology leininger took the culture construct from anthropology and care from nursing and reformulated these two dominant constructs into culture care her pioneering work began with her theory of cultural care diversity and universality.
