The author's insights and comments, as he tries to unravel and come to grips with the perplexing mess of racial intolerance, domination and bigotry that was South Africa, are revealing about the times but also about the author's own views and prejudices."

Back lionel rogosin my presence today december 12 2000 at the burial of lionel rogosin at hollywood forever cemetery located on 6000 santa monica boulevard at the heart of hollywood was a tribute to a remarkable man who in filming e back africa clandestinely in 1958 in south africa had captured the last intellectual snapshot of some members of the sophiatown renaissance cultural. E back africa was one of the first films to expose black africans life under apartheid to the world in 1959 but beyond its significance as a historical time capsule the american premiere of the 2005 restoration with fresh subtitles reveals a striking exemplar of the political docufiction of director lionel rogosin.

Lionel rogosin s second film is a bona fide milestone of african cinema it s so noble and so powerful that its flaws are entirely excusable in any case the reasons behind the film s slightly uneven tone are intriguing e back africa was made under stressful conditions the nosy apartheid supporting south african government continually threatened to interfere. Once again rogosin won an award at the venice film festival and e back africa was instrumental in raising awareness outside of africa about the appalling

conditions which existed under apartheid for his next film good times wonderful times 1965 rogosin scrapped even the minimal neo realist narratives which had anchored his first. Milestone presents it and several other films on e back africa the films of lionel rogosin volume 2 almost immediately rogosin began visiting south africa to figure out how he could film a drama exposing the evils of apartheid the segregationist policy made official in 1948 that reduced the rights of and government services available to minorities especially the majority black. E back africa is even less like a doc than its predecessor yet there on the imdb in black and white it is categorized as yup a documentary instead it is a narrative movie about a relatively young black man living in south africa during that country s dreadful near half century of apartheid in it rogosin shown at right tracks the activities of this man his name is zacharia.

Lionel rogosin cooperating with the staff of the iconic drum magazine of the 1950s created an accurate and unbiased portrayal of township life in south africa under apartheid starring a collection of south africa s brightest black urban stars this film broke new ground in the manner in which it showcased african urban identity and the hardships and realities of township life in the magical. Lionel rogosin s religion could be dubbed liberation cinematography he made films as a way to fight injustice in 1957 rogosin followed his calling to south africa creating e back africa a powerful and moving drama exposing the harsh reality of life under the system apartheid.
